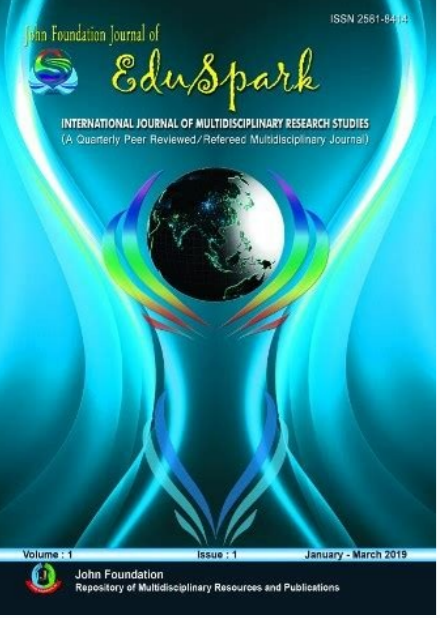
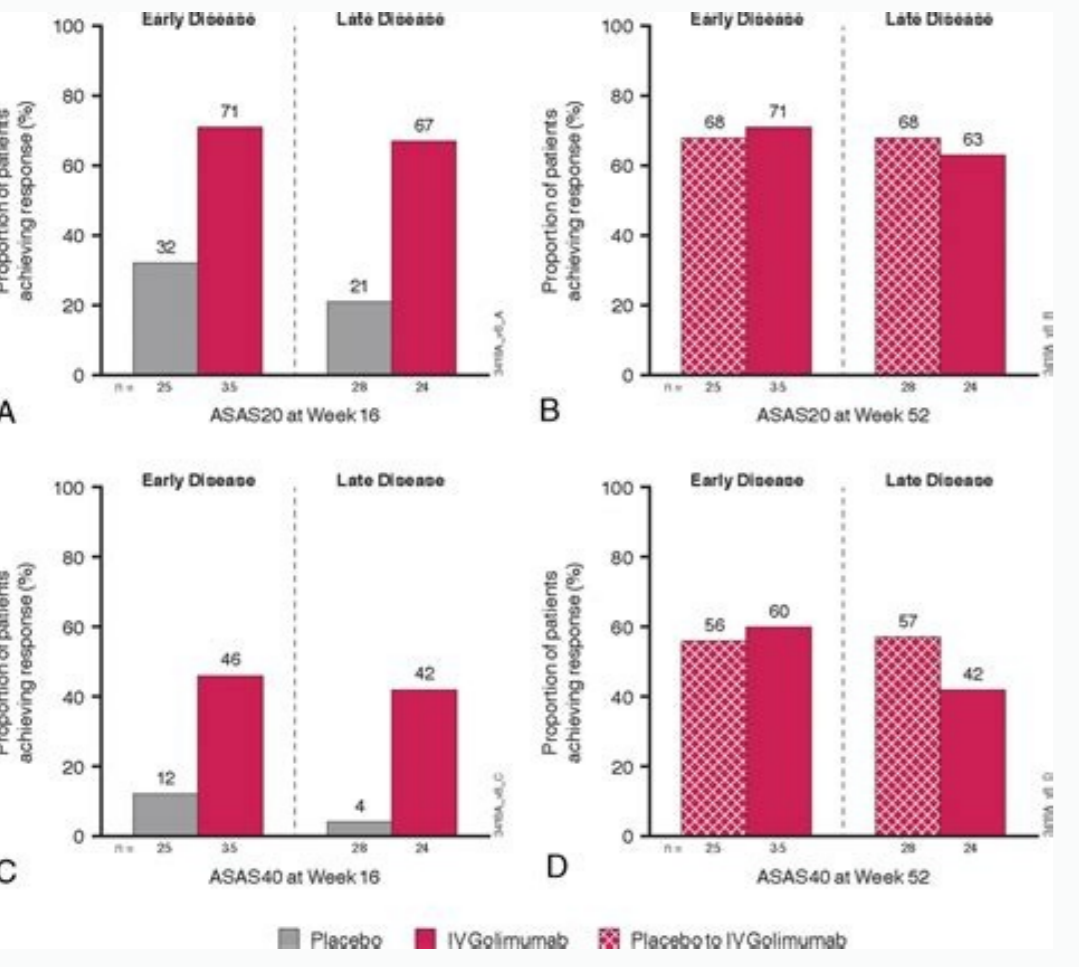


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Indian Priest scientist ranked among the world's top 1 percent scientists in Biology

Fr. Savarimuthu Ignacimuthu

- Dr. Fr. Savarimuthu Ignacimuthu SJ holds a PhD and a DSc. He served as the principal of St. Xavier's College, Palayamkottai and also at the Loyola College, Chennai. He was vice-chancellor of Bharathiar University, Coimbatore, and University of Madras, Chennai. He also led at the Entomology Research Institute, Loyola College, Chennai, during the period from 1993 to 2015.
- He has published more than 800 research papers and 80 books; he holds 12 Indian patents and two US patents. He has helped more than 200 students to get their doctoral degrees.
- One insect species *Jacthraps ignacimuthu* and one natural molecule *ignaciomycin* is named after him. He was instrumental in developing Xavier's natural herbal sanitizer to protect against pathogens including COVID-19. He had also developed a natural herbal biopesticide *Pomponem* to control insect pests.

Stanford University professors had analyzed the contributions of more than 100,000 scientists from all over the world in biology and ranked Fr. Ignacimuthu among the top 1% scientists in biology considering his work during the period 1985 to 2018.

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
