



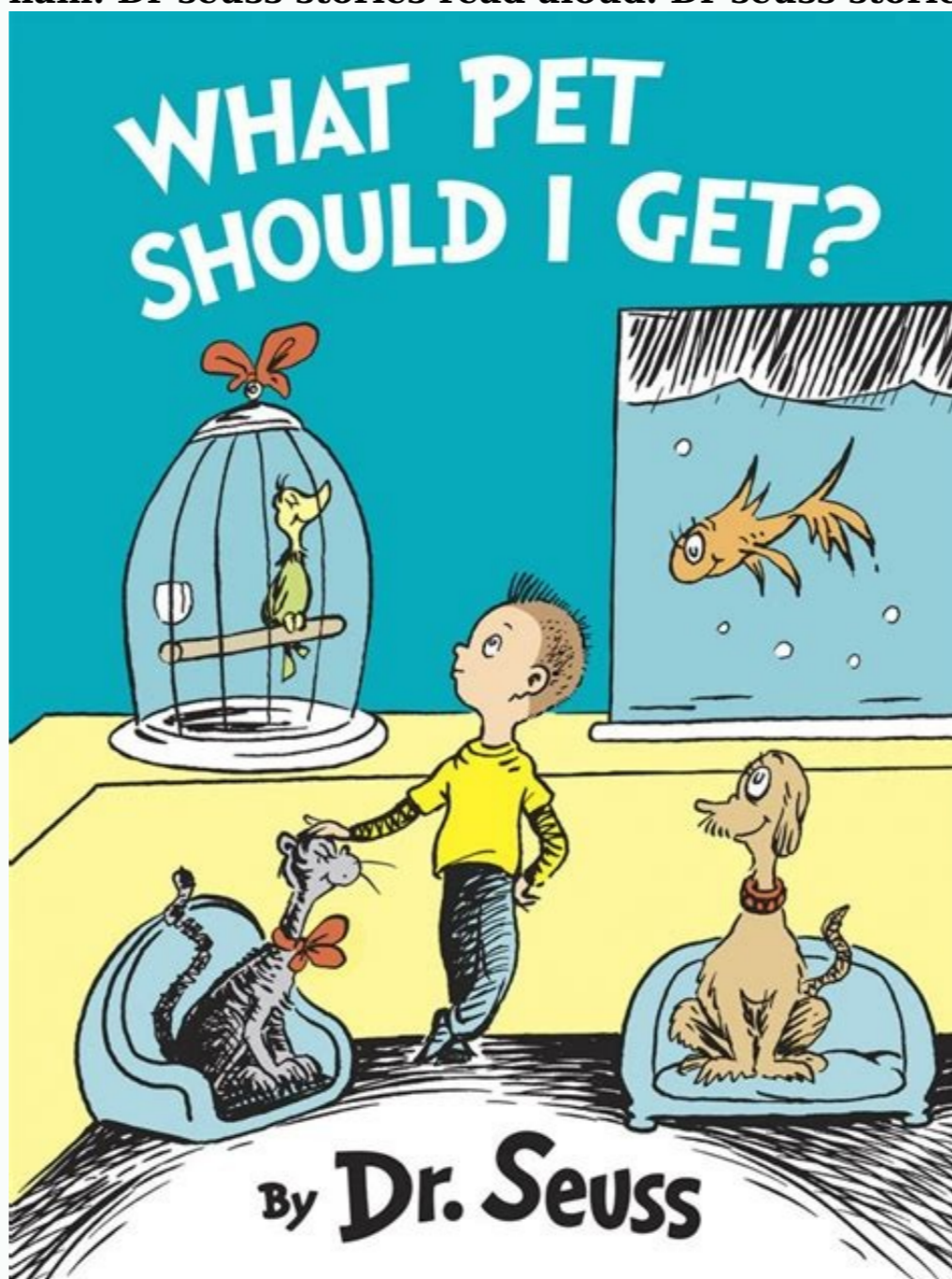

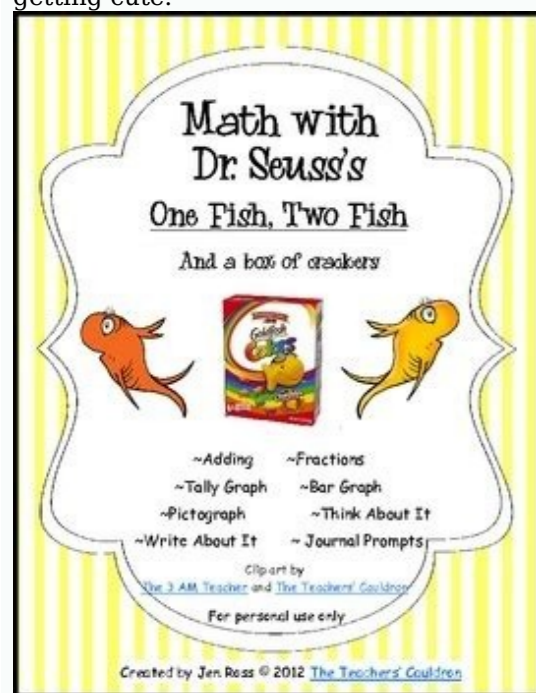

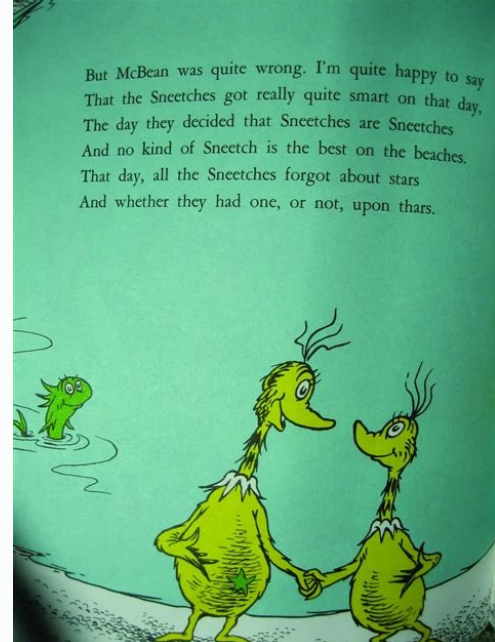

Some of his characters later appeared in the work of his children. After illustrating a series of funny books, Geisel decided to write a children's book, which was reportedly rejected by nearly 30 publishers. After a chance meeting with a friend who was an editor at the Vanguard Press and thought a waw to Mulberry Street was finally published in 1937. The young man is at the job center! Despite the various difficulties, Horton refuses: "I said what I said and I said what I was going to do. The elephant is one hundred percent true!" He is finally rewarded when a creature with bird wings and an elephant's head illuminates the egg during World War II. A quiz for classic children's books, Geysel's attention went to politics. In the early 1940s, he went to editor-in-chief of PM magazine in New York. He then served (1942-1946) in the US Army, where he was sent to a documentary filmmaker. In 1945 he wrote "Her Work in Germany". Frank Capra: It was later turned into the Academy Award-winning film "Hitler Is Alive" (1945), although Heisel was not mentioned. After completing the sound service, he continued in films. With his first wife, Helen Palmer, Geisel wrote the Oscar-winning documentary Design for Death (1947).
