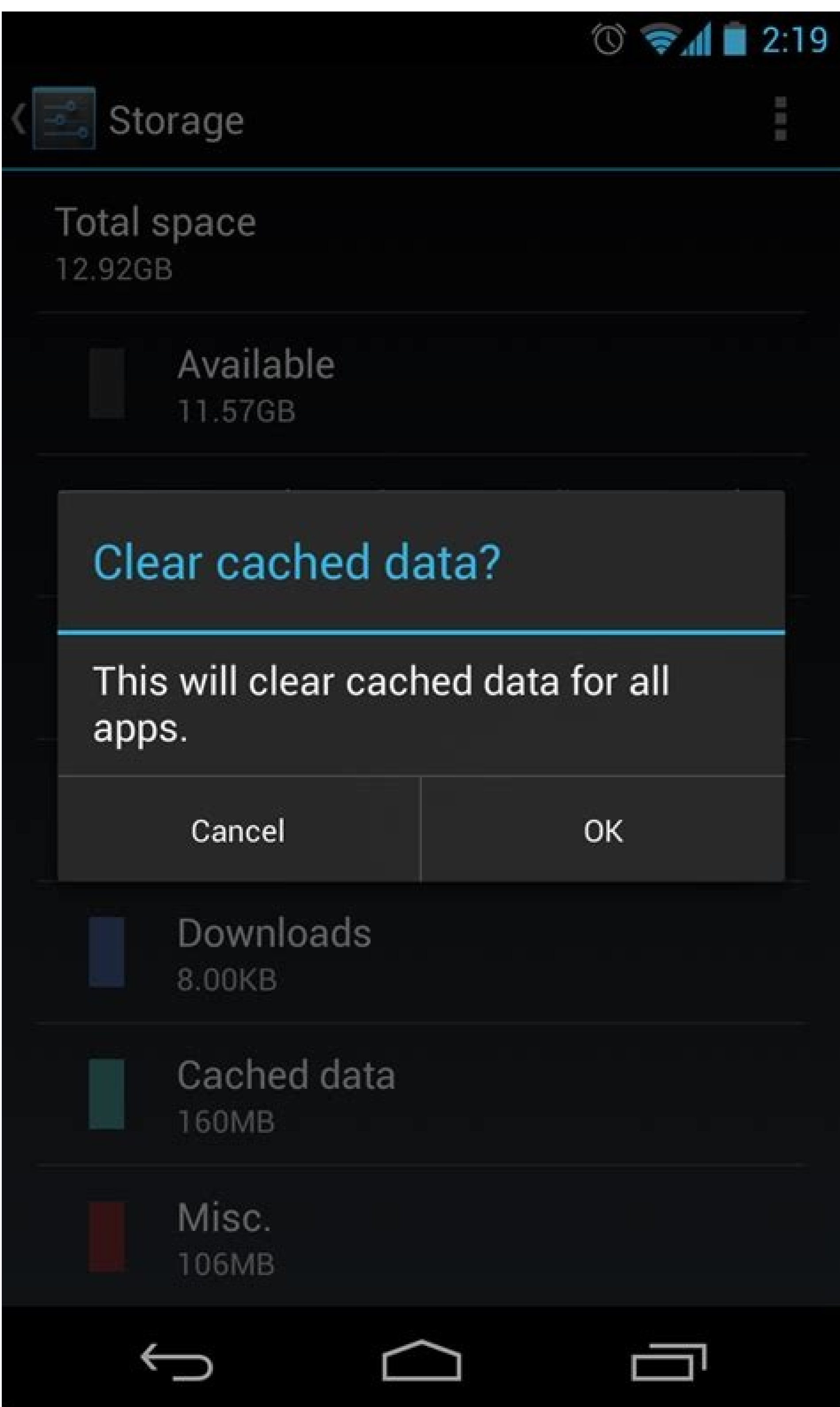

Clear data



Clearing your mobile browser's cache may help resolve a variety of issues, including trouble when browsing your library website, signing in, or downloading titles. **Android** Open your browser. **Android browser:** Go to Menu > More > Settings or Menu > Settings > Privacy & Security. **Chrome:** Go to Menu > Settings > Privacy. **Android browser:** Tap Clear cache, Clear history, and Clear all cookie data as appropriate. **Chrome:** Tap Clear browsing data at the bottom of the screen, leave the defaults selected (browsing history, cache, and cookies), then tap Clear. **iOS** From the home screen, go to Settings > Safari. Clearing cache is very important on your phone or any other device as clearing them fixes various issues such as loading and formatting problems on the website. After that, on the top, you will have to select the time range for the period you wish to clear the cache. If you want to delete everything, choose 'All time.' After that, you will have to check two boxes: "Cookies and site data" and "Cached images and files." Click on "Clear data," and all your cache will be clear. **Clearing Cache from Third-Party Apps** Here is how to clear the cache on Android from third-party apps: On the phone, go to the Settings menu. Click on the Storage option. Under the Storage option, you will see Device Storage, select that and click on Internal Storage. Under this option, you will see "Cached Data," tap on that. A dialogue box will appear as soon as you click on it; click 'Ok' when it asks if you are sure to clear all cache. This will not delete app data but can delete account information, so be prepared for it when you clear cache from any third-party app. **What Changes are Expected in the Device After Clearing the Cache?** There won't be any major changes, but yes, there are small things that you should be aware of: Some settings might get changed or deleted on your phone. For instance, you need to sign in again. Your sites might seem slower than usual; the reason behind it is that it takes time to load the pictures and videos again, but after a while, it works faster than before. Don't worry; it will not log you out of the apps or cause major changes. Also, you will not lose data like game progress, browser bookmarks, etc. **How Frequently Should You Clear Cache?** You must be thinking about when to clear cache - weekly, monthly, half-yearly, etc. Well, it is not required to clear the cache very frequently; you can clear it once a month. If you need space on your device, then it is recommended to

remove the apps that you don't use much, or the other way is to archive the videos saved in the cloud. If you, you must be clear the cache in your phone.
